ABC Newsflash 1 April 2010 "NSW Premier John Brogden today officially opened a brand new 100-berth marina at Greenwell Point, the Seafood Centre of the South Coast".

Sound far-fetched? Well OK, the bit about John Brogden might be, but it's not beyond the realms of possibility that we might one day have a marina.

A meeting of Council's Industrial Development and Employment Committee held on 4 July 2005 recommended that:

- potential marina sites in the Shoalhaven be identified
- a situation report on the status of a marina in and around Jervis bay be prepared; and,

A recent proposal to Council for rezoning the old Rosebery Spray factory and surrounding industrial land generated some interesting comments in a report presented to Council's Development Committee on 12 July.

"Any proposal for further subdivision of land at Greenwell Point will increase the population at risk and potential damages due to flooding for the area. There will also be greater reliance on emergency services, since the subdivision is likely to attract new people to the area who are not necessarily flood aware."

"... it may not be in the best interest of the Greenwell Point community to permit residential development that would take up land for industrial purposes that could accommodate land uses such as 'trucking operators' or 'motor mechanics' in the future."

The Director of Planning, Ernie Royston, concluded that "due to the preliminary findings of the draft Lower Shoalhaven Floodplain Risk Management Study it is not considered that the rezoning request can be supported at this time."





Slipway closed for repairs

Shoalhaven City Council will close the Greenwell Point Slipway during August 2005 to allow for essential upgrading work to be undertaken.

The West Street slipway is one of two operated by Council and provides an essential service to the boating community. The other Council operated slipway is located in Ulladulla Harbour.

Shoalhaven City Council's City Services Director, Barry Russell, said Council has been working closely with the Jervis Bay Cruising Yacht Club and other customers to ensure the upgraded facility will continue to meet their requirements.

Work will involve replacement of steel structural members, upgrading of stormwater controls and provision of additional supports to minimise the risk of boats falling over while on the slipway.

Field of dreams syndrome

Around 30 local residents fronted up to our July meeting to hear what guest speaker Greg Watson had to say on the Shoalhaven Water situation.

The Mayor gave an interesting and informative presentation which helped put Sydney's water plans into context.

The main issue of concern to Council is the arbitrary proposal to increase the environmental flow limits from 90 m/litres to 400 m/litres.

Clr Watson showed several graphs which clearly demonstrated that if this limit was imposed then all the Shoalhaven's reservoirs would have been empty at some time in the past few years.

We have written a letter of thanks to the Mayor and offered community support to back any lobbying that may be required with the State Government.

The minutes of the meeting are posted on the GTP website and also on the information board outside the Community Hall. Check 'em out.
