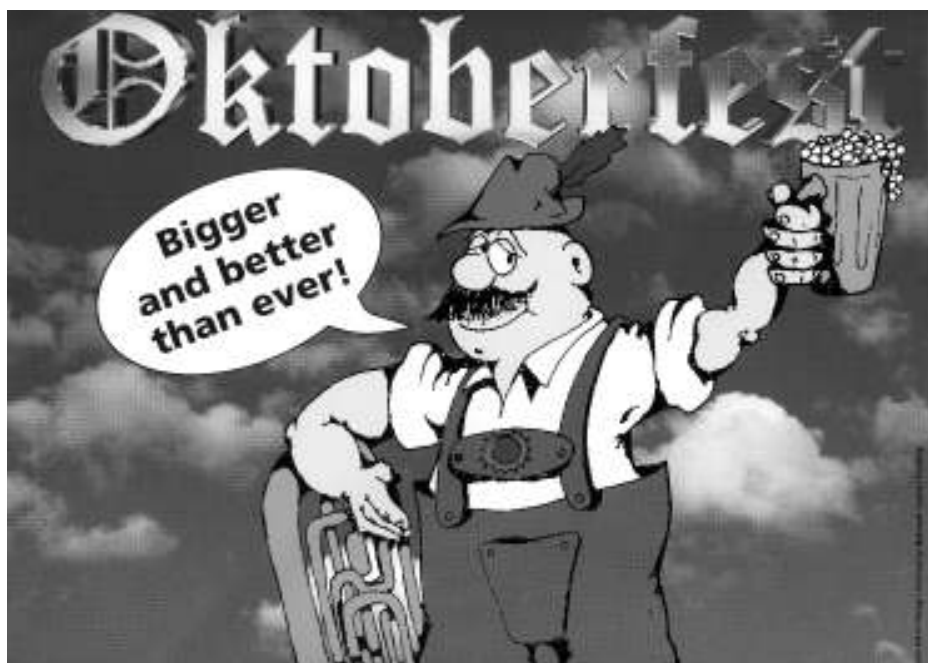

Foreshore Happenings

Some three years ago, the Greenwell Point Chamber of Commerce which had been instrumental in the formation of the Greenwell Point Get To the Point Programme, "amalgamated" with the organisation, as they had very similar objectives. The GTTP programme has made significant achievements and continues to progress towards making Greenwell Point a better place to live, visit and conduct business.

Many people have benefited considerably from what the GTTP programme has achieved, in particular with regard to the foreshore rehabilitation landscaping, and they and others will benefit further with the forthcoming boat ramps and parking area. Planning for the boat ramps is well advanced and indications are that it will be at least equal to the best of the facilities on the South Coast. \$100,000 has been made available from the Recreational Fishing Grants, \$200,000 is sought from NSW Maritime and indications are that this will be made available with both these amounts to be matched by our Council with construction scheduled to commence in the 2008/09 financial year.

Also, work is due to shortly commence on further restoration work near Church Street and at Anzac Park. One fishing platform (there were to be two but the tenders came in too high) to the north of Titania Park is scheduled for completion before Christmas, as is further landscaping to the north and south of the swimming pool and in Anzac Park. The value of this work is approximately \$200,000.

It is highly probable that very little if any of these improvements would be taking place without the continual efforts of the GTTP programme members.

The Greenwell Point Master Plan, the preliminary plans for the boat ramps, pontoons and parking area will be on display at the Hall at the next Meeting on the 18th October, so if you would like to know what's happening in your village, and, would like the opportunity to influence it, the monthly meeting is the place to be.

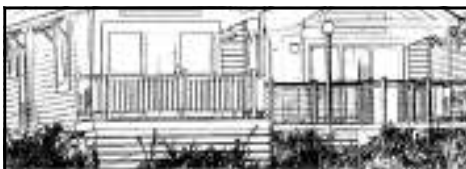
