

The Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital Auxiliary Greenwell Point

In about 1946 or 47, the late Ald Walter P. Watson, a member of the former Nowra Municipality council, introduced to council the matter of establishing a General Hospital in Nowra. Council adopted the idea, and formed a small committee representing the council and local citizens to pursue the matter. Amongst those on the committee were Aldermen Watson and Glass, Mrs N. Rodway O.B.E. (Red Cross), Mr R P Young (Chamber of Commerce), Mr Eric Saddler, (Man Power Officer, later C.E.S.) and other interested citizens.

The committee went about the business in a professional manner, and enlisted the services of the Nowra Town Clerk, Mr W.C. Batt ex-officio, a member of the committee to coordinate the Committee's activities with the Council. Mr Saddler was elected Honorary Secretary.

One of the first tasks of the Committee, was to engender the support the community, and to that end, a series of public meetings were held both within and

beyond the municipality of Nowra.

The support was unanimous, which was most encouraging, particularly so as there were then seven Local Government Councils within the area. These were later formed into the Shire of Shoalhaven, (now known as Shoalhaven City Council.)

In 1947, the Board of the Shoalhaven District Hospital was gazetted, and about 1949/50 a start was made to build a pre-fabricated 20 bed hospital, consisting of 6 male public ward beds, 4 male intermediate ward beds with the same number for females

This was opened on 21st May 1951, and in the years following, an additional 8 male and female beds were added together with 4 children's cots, making this a 32 bed hospital.

With the Gazettal of the Board of Directors, an effort was made to form a Hospital Auxiliary. In 1950, the Greenwell Point committee, already very active, received the status of a

Hospital Auxiliary. Mrs Jeanie Evans nee Skinner, was the foundation President, and Mrs Wheeler, Hon., Secretary.

In 1958, a new building was opened as a Maternity Unit consisting of 29 beds as follows—12 intermediate, 16 Public and 1 Single Room. In May 1972, a further building extension was completed in accordance with the following details: 36 intermediate Ward beds, 4 Intensive Care Ward beds and 2 Recovery Ward beds, together with new operating theatre block with twin theatres, new administrative section, new kitchen and associated dining rooms. Besides these, a new children's ward was opened.

Subscribing to all these additions, Greenwell Point Auxiliary, has been proud to have materially helped in providing items of capital equipment.

What is U.H.A.

Formed by Mrs Eleanor Mackinnon, O.B.E. in 1933, U.H.A. has become the co-ordinating body for many groups of voluntary workers within the Public Health System. Auxiliaries have existed since the days of the Rum Hospital—voluntary services have been present, working for Public Hospitals, Day Care Centres, Community Health and Rehabilitation Centres.

Under the auspices of the Health Department of N.S.W., the Branches include Fundraising groups, Service Groups ("Pink Ladies") and those who work in a variety of roles in the Day Care and rehabilitation Centres.

Fundraising is a major part of the work Auxiliaries raise money to provide additional items for use by the patients and staff. Service Groups perform a large number of duties, and these vary greatly from place to place, driving, flower arranging, hairdressing, shopping, personal laundry, letter writing, craft activities, assistance to visitors,

guides, trolley service and so much more.

Each year Zone Days are held, so that five or six neighbouring auxiliaries may meet and discuss problems, fundraising ideas, hear guest speakers, and learn about current health and hospital matters. Within the State Regions, there are Zones, each Region has a Triennial Conference, and the main event each year is the General Conference in Sydney. At the Annual General Conference many resolutions are debated, and some of these over the years have changed or influenced Health Dept directives and Legislation.

This part of the work is extremely important. It is two-fold. It enables members at Annual General Conference to become better informed and aware of health matters, and, allows them to contribute to the debate and to influence Government to introduce various measures to benefit the entire community. All matters pertaining to Health should

interest and concern U.H.A. members. Matters of accident prevention, road safety, immunisation awareness, advertising standards, medication labelling, I.V.F., conditions in hospitals etc., all come within the orbit of U.H.A.; anything which causes stress, creates or prevents ill-health is U.H.A. business.

U.H.A. is under the auspices of the Health Dept. of N.S.W., but has complete autonomy of administration and policy. The activities and policies are determined by the Central Executive Committee of U.H.A. and not the Health Dept. The committee consists of an elected Rep., from each State Region, and a nominee from the Health Dept. One of this number is elected Chairman by the Executive Committee Members. The office is administered on a full-time basis by a state Secretary and other staff as required. All money raised by Auxiliaries, is raised in the community for the community, and apart from a small affiliation fee, no money is on

Fishing News Culburra Bait and Tackle

Well the weather hasn't been too bad, considering we have had a few cold days with a bit of wind thrown in. That doesn't stop the urge of most fisherman to head out and wet a line. The fishing has not been too bad although the flat-head in the river have slowed down, as they usually do at this time of year. However, the bream and the blackfish have stolen the lime light at the moment, with some nice blackfish turning up. As most black fishers know there has been the odd small fish mixed in, but the bigger ones have definitely been about, with the wharf and other predominant spots still firing. We have gone to great lengths to get some good quality green weed in the shop. I can tell by the taste testing and the old faithful sniff test, we've been getting the two thumbs up. So, if anyone is looking for some, don't hesitate to drop in. The bream have been of better size of late, with some nice fish around the bream hole, and also the wharf at night. There has been some rather large bream comps held on the river of late, and the word getting back is the bream have all been of good size. I won't bore you with going into the ins and outs of bream fishing with plastics, but I can say if you are only starting out the best outfit would be a rod around the 7' mark, a 1500 to 2500 size reel, 4lb to 6lb fire line, (fire line is used instead of mono as it doesn't sink, allowing you to see the bites), and a must is 4 to 6lb fluorocarbon leader, a 2grm jig head, and either camo worm in gulp or 80mm squidgy wriggler as you lure, and you're away. The biggest thing fishing with plastics is time; everything you do needs to be slow, if you move too fast then you will introduce yourself to tailor fishing. It is a bit of an art but like anything, practice makes perfect.

Last article we were in waiting for the arrival of the yellowfin tuna, and, the waiting is over, yes, there is, and has been some good numbers over the shelf; some fish pulling the scales to 60kg. There have been some big eye, and some big blue fin taken; the bigger fish have been taken a bit wide for the average amateur, but between the 500 and 1000 fathom lines. There have been good numbers of albacore and yellowfin, with the yellowfin being around the 35 to 40 kg mark.

Talking about nice fish, there has also been some very good kingfish around. Can't say where as I value my life too much, but the biggest one of the three has been 36kg the other two have been 31kg and 34kg.

I know there are many older fisherman and pros thinking: "been there, done that," but now these guys too have gone and done it, and let me tell you they are pretty happy, as well they may be.

FORESHORE HAPPENINGS

I have not been able to gain any further information regarding the Lands Department putting forward the possibility of a marina at Greenwell Point and the calling of tenders for the jetty, floating pontoon, boat ramps and parking area being delayed in order to avoid a conflict with a marina proposal. During the last 8 years there have been a number of studies conducted and a Master Plan developed, all being required before the launching ramps and associated infrastructure could proceed.

- Shoalhaven River Definition Study
- Greenwell Point Master Plan
- Launching Ramp Location Study
- Environmental Impact Study
- Hydrographic Study

The cost of these studies including the Master Plan was hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Once these studies were completed the design and documentation for the launching ramps and associated infrastructure was undertaken at a cost of approximately \$90,000. This Project is ready to be advertised for tender but is being withheld due to the abovementioned possible conflict. Today a small amount of bitumen was placed on the access road to the existing boat ramp: why? How about asking a Councillor what is going on? It is an election year so this may be a way of finding out who is interested in Greenwell Point!

Some positive news: The access to the first fishing platform is currently being improved and a seat/table has been installed adjacent to the platform. It's an interesting item and I suggest that you have a gander.

I'm informed that the first of the materials for the foreshore work between Church Street and Albert Avenue will be delivered this week. (the last week in May)
