

BOAT RAMP V MARINA

Physical Design and Environment

After a number of rumours about funds being withdrawn, and then the Lands Department suggesting the possibility of a Marina at Greenwell Point, things weren't looking too promising. On Tuesday morning the 24th, 2ST announced that the project would be delayed 6 months, and then on the ABC, Rebecca Rudd considered that we should be maintaining infrastructure rather than constructing new boat ramps at Currarong and Greenwell Point. An email was immediately sent to Councillor Rudd advising her of the error of her ways with a copy to Ward 2 Councillors seeking their support for the Manager's Report to Council. A copy of this Report is below as I believe it is the best way to "tell the story" and the resolution follows.

Also at this Council meeting the Council agreed to provide \$5,500 for the resurfacing of the tennis court, so, with our \$5,000 contribution one would hope that this work will now proceed.

Report of General Manager Ordinary Meeting Tuesday, 24th June 2008 Strategic Planning/City Services and Operations

Greenwell Point Boat Launching Ramp File 29107-02

The Executive Marina Review Committee meeting of 11th June 2008 considered a presentation from the NSW Lands Department in relation to a proposed marina at Greenwell Point. The Committee recommended that the Industrial Development and Employment Committee make the recommendation to Council that the Greenwell Point Plan of Management be amended to incorporate a marina development.

It is understood from the meeting that concern was raised that the Council proposed boat launching ramp and floating pontoon development may impact on the number of berths provided by any proposed marina development.

Council is advised that if the marina proceeds (in whatever design format), an option is available for the boat ramp pontoon to be shortened with the option of a "L Shape" second pontoon being constructed on the edge of the boat launching ramp. This option allows the number of berthing spaces of any marina not to be impacted and with minimal loss in functionality of the boat launching ramp.

Coastal engineering consultants were engaged by Council in 2005 to undertake a comparative assessment into the current location and a Northern location. The advantage of the existing location is its complete protection from tidal currents. Relocating the ramp to the North will be at a higher cost and the assessment report advised that "risk posed at the Northern location by the very high currents renders this option hazardous to boating activity". If a marina is to proceed, the boat ramp remaining in its current position would also benefit from wind wave protection

provided by the marina structure. This benefit will not be obtained if it relocated to the North.

The matter of possible conflict of the boat ramp and pontoon project with a future marina proposal has been the subject of discussions with Council and Department of Lands staff. The Department of Lands have concurred with Council proceeding with the boat ramp and pontoon project in its current proposed location. Relocating the location of the boat ramp is likely to require:

1. The need to change the Greenwell Point Foreshore Reserve Plan of Management (\$10,000)
2. New survey, design and Review of Environmental Factors (\$30,000)
3. Additional construction cost (\$40,000) with some savings by having a shorter pontoon
4. Extension of the rock promontory to deflect tidal currents (\$150,000)
5. Possible loss of \$100,000 in Commonwealth Grant funding if the project cannot be completed by April 2009.

Apart from likely extra costs of \$230,000, a change in location will defer the project for about six months. Tender documents are completed and are ready to be advertised for tender. It is recommended that the boat ramp remain in its current location. Refer to attached plans (Attachment "A").

RECOMMENDED that

A) Tenders be advertised for the Greenwell Point Boat Launching Ramp; and

B) Council note that the option exists for the floating pontoon to be modified at a future date to incorporate any proposed marina development.

Greenwell Point Boat Ramps & Associated Infrastructure. There have been rumours circulating regarding the withdrawal of the funds for the “Boat Ramp Project”, but it is understood that this funding is to remain in the budget. A Report is being presented to Council at next Tuesday’s meeting and it is expected that it will be ac-

cepted, so enabling the project to be advertised for tender, hopefully very shortly after the meeting.

Foreshore Rehabilitation and Fishing Platforms.

The fishing platform in Titania Park has been refurbished as well as more work being done in the Park near the playground.

There have been delays outside the control of Council and it is now planned that the work between Church Street and Albert Avenue will commence shortly after the coming school holidays.

Dave McCorkell has put copies of the Master Plan and Boat Ramps with infrastructure in the windows of the vacant shop next to the estate agent and they have generated favourable comment.

Vandalism.

More signs have been reported damaged or removed from areas. It was also discussed at this meeting that a number of break-ins have occurred in the village as of late. A complete boat on trailer was taken from one area. A boat motor and quad bike from another as an example. Please be aware and vigilant of your surroundings and that this is happening in our village. 
