

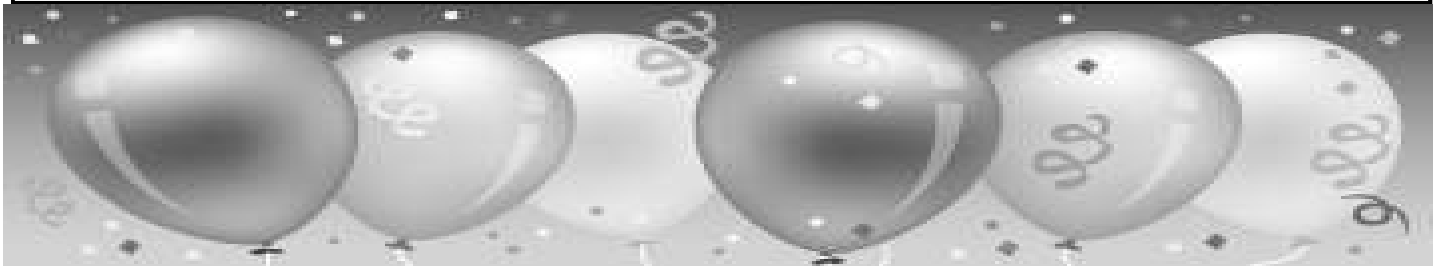

GTTPP programmers have been very active the past year, and through continued liaison and dialogue with Council, some notable results have been achieved. We can also look forward to some exciting improvements this coming year.

Through enthusiastic work of committee and members, the following are some of the highlights of the past year's achievements:-

Upgrading of Greenwell Point Highway sign in Nowra.

Anzac Park upgrade. This excellent work was carried out by our local contracting firm of TCL (Kate & Jim Carr) and us a credit to The Point.

Foreshore improvements to Anzac Park and Swimming Pool, with a fabulous timber fishing platform at Titania Park and rock/sand fishing access at Shaw's Creek.

Titania Park repair of swale area with a landscaped rock outlet area.

Approved by Council to share fund the resurfacing of the **Tennis Court**, so prepare yourself for a tennis revival.

Council has installed new **Children's play equipment** at Gordon Ravel Park.

Refurbishment of Main (sand) boat ramp. Council has received \$300K government contributions, and approved the advertising of tenders for work to commence this year. Construction of boat ramp will not hinder the possible marina investigations.

Goodnight Island project still progressing, despite some small impediments to progress.

Exciting launch of **GTP Gallery and Craft shop**, aiming for an August opening. Being driven by an enthusiastic team, headed by Vera Farnham and Janelle Tompsett.


