

FORESHORE HAPPENINGS

BOAT RAMP

Construction of the boat ramp is proceeding well, and is scheduled for completion by the 3rd of July, 2009.

The underwater planks for the two ramps are in place, including their rock protection.

The concrete slabs leading from the planks up to the road are under construction at the time of writing.

Once these slabs are complete, the jetty (abutment) leading to the hinged section of the pontoon will be constructed.

The four piles that will restrain the floating pontoon are in place, and the pontoon will extend a little past the end pile, where it will be possible to tie up a boat of reasonable draught, even at low tide.

The pontoon sections are constructed of polypropylene, surrounded by an aluminium alloy frame with a hardwood decking. These have been manufactured in Sydney and are ready for delivery.

This facility with the two boat ramps separated by the pontoon, will prevent one user from blocking both ramps and although this cost considerably more than a dual lane ramp, the extra cost is

considered to be well justified. The ramps lead into water deep enough to launch most boats at low tide, so that taking all into account, it will provide Greenwell Point with an unparalleled facility that will be the envy of many.

BOAT RAMP CAR PARK

At the time of writing, the tenders for the car park have been evaluated, and the tender recommendation is ready for submission to Council for approval. Drawings of the boat ramp and car park are on display in the window of the vacant shop next to the Gallery and Craft, and although they do not represent exactly what is being constructed for both the boat ramp and car park, they do give a worthwhile representation. The current drawings show 29 spaces for vehicles with boat trailers, with one of these being a space for disabled, and 14 spaces for vehicles without trailers, with two of these being for the disabled.

LANDSCAPING

Most, if not all of the \$150,000 provided to Greenwell Point from the "Rudd Bank", will go towards landscaping the area between the forthcoming boat ramp car park and the foreshore. Kaye Murray, landscape architect from Council, who has done the recent terrific work for Greenwell Point i.e. the Village entrance, the swimming pool fencing and landscaping, and the refurbishment of Anzac Park is shortly meeting with Get to the Point people to gather their ideas for this

coming landscape work.

THE FUTURE

The Get to the Point Programme has forwarded our wish list to Council, but it is not expected that we will benefit very much from it before next year. The wish list comprises predominantly those items left outstanding in the Master Plan, i.e. bicycle track, walking tracks, tree plantings, drainage, kerb and guttering, Main Street landscaping etc/.

The larger space has allowed Juanita to expand her range of beautiful, sustainable products, with more than 50 brands of organic, fair trade, recycled and environmentally friendly gifts and homewares, including organic cotton children's clothing, sun jars and glow bricks, organic teas, beauty products and natural cleaning products.

One wise Owl's previous location at Shop Two, is now occupied by Penny Barker and

Michael White's always interesting, quirky and surprising store Full Circle Design. Penny and Michael recently made the move to Jindyandy from their previous location at Culburra Beach. At Full Circle, visitors can browse to the sounds of vinyl records through a range of retro furniture, recycled plastic Melissa designer shoes from

Brazil, hand woven bags from Togo, gorgeous Indian jewellery, quilts and soft furnishings custom made locally, shell and driftwood wall hangings and much, much more. Penny and Michael, made the seachange from Sydney to the South Coast two years ago. Also on offer is an interior design service and they will soon be stocking and serving a range of fine teas, including exotic

blends such as White Peony. Golden Monkey, lapsang Souchong and Peppermint chai.

Get to the Point Recycling Trial

The halfway mark in the recycling bin trial has come and gone in the blink of an eye. Council would like to thank you for the support you have shown, and for achieving results that are in excess of 80% recovery – this is a result we can justifiably be proud of, and will stand up with the best in the world.

On Monday 11th May, about 50 people attended the mid-trial feedback session at the Bowling Club. The feedback was incredibly positive, with some robust discussion about some of the key issues. Council staff are thrilled that people in the Greenwell Point community have generally embraced the objectives of the trial, and are providing very useful feedback into the design of a full scale system. If you would like to provide further feedback, forms are available at the drop in every Monday and Thursday.

The biggest issues are flies and smells. So how do we address this? The possibilities can be as simple as increasing the collection frequency to a weekly pick up, to improving the biodegradable bags or even providing a microbial odour treatment. Another possibility is to go back to how you managed the smelly stuff before – a lot of people freeze their discarded prawns or meat bones until collection day.

What about the compost? It is early days yet as the compost will take more than 3 months to mature. After that we will get it tested according to the Australian Standards for compost, and if this passes, it will become a saleable product and the proof that this system does work. Council has yet to decide on what to do with the product, but it is hoped that it can go back into the community, either through Parks and Reserves, or directly.

What are the main problems at the sorting plant and compost facility? It can be summed up in one word – bags. Normal plastic (shopping) bags are still coming through in the white bin materials. These are very different to the biodegradable bags we issued to you and do not compost. In the orange bin, however, you can place the normal plastic bag, and if it is filled with the yuk stuff please tie it up!

Finally, we have had great feedback from everyone who has gone on the recycling factory and compost tours. They are a real opportunity to find out just what does happen to all your waste. Please contact us on 4429 3374 to book in for the next tour on 9th June.
