



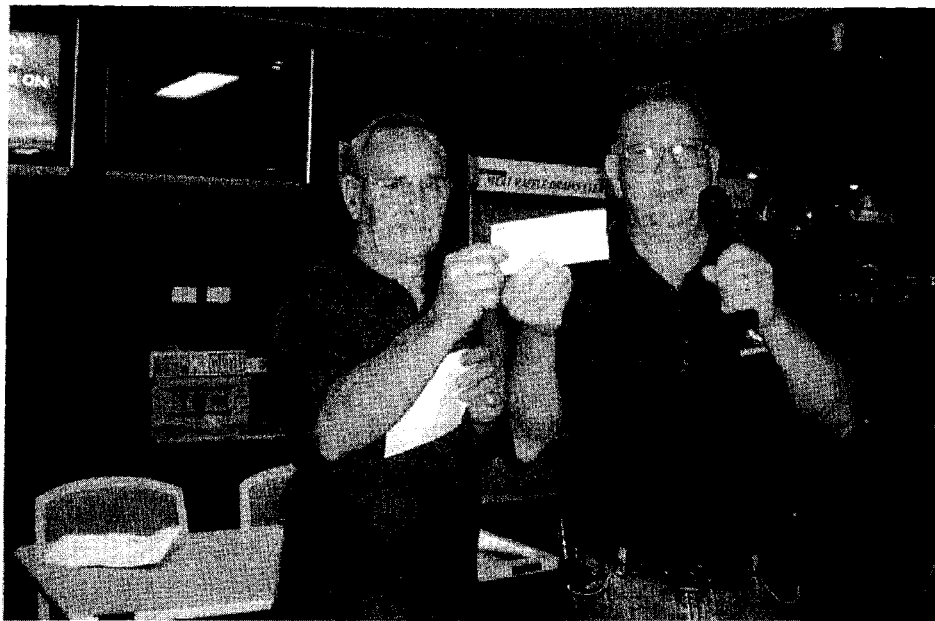

John would like to thank the Club and everyone involved in raising the funds, and for supporting the Fire Brigade in this way.

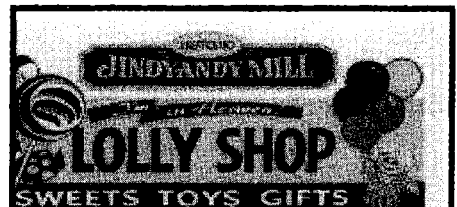

Fishing News

Welcome to winter, this time of year is for some, not their ideal time of year, but for others, it is all just about to begin, well let's hope anyway!

This time of year sees the big end of town roll through, and with that, yellowfin, jewfish, bream and snapper all playing a major role in winter fun.

Around here lately, I don't think I have ever seen as many anglers waiting for that momentous time when we get the word that the yellowfin are on, but this season has been stalled to some degree, with water temps not being conducive to heading out in search of the big fin. There have been a few, although, last weekend saw a few fish but nothing to get excited over. If excitement comes in the form of marlin, then catching one in the middle of June is pretty awesome, as two guys now have found out. With fingers crossed and the old weather gods playing a helping hand, we should see some action in the not too distant future.

Around the inshore areas, kingies and reds have held their end of the bargain, with some nice kings on jigs showing up along with some very nice reds. The reds have also been a bit on the

shy side, but 5 fish over 3kg last weekend is nothing to shy away from. They are still there, it's just that it is more of a challenge than in past month's. Yes my good friends, the leather jackets are back, and back they are, with anglers finding it hard to get round them to get to the bottom which was our plan all along. Although they haven't seemed to have taken a liking to the deeper water as yet, and that has been were some of the better fish have been located.

The rivers and bays have all still been fishing ok, with some nice jewfish moving around and still some nice blackfish. Bream are on the move, and ask anyone who is right in to this type of fishing, and they will all respond with "you must fish slow"; with lures, that is. What we mean by slow doesn't mean cast out your lure and just sit down for a cup of tea for half an hour, it means the retrieve you have been doing over the past couple of months should be a little bit different, now, as the fish are not as active as they were when the water is warmer. Summer would generally see you doing more aggressive lifts but now a slower, lighter approach is needed.

Off the stones, the drummer are still around in good numbers, but yet again, further south is fishing a whole lot better. Uludulla and south are all seeing good pigs and the odd nice groper. Salmon are still on the chew, anglers spinning off most ledges have had their fair share of them in the past couple of weeks.

Well, that about wraps it up for this week, if you have ventured out and caught a cracker, send us your pic culburra-bait@people.net.au or for any fishy questions 44472087 and I'll see you on the water.

Recycling Bin Trial comes to an end

Well, Monday 22nd June was the last day of the recycling bin trial.... Haven't these three months flashed by so quickly!

The Waste Services staff at Council would like to sincerely thank all the residents of Greenwell Point for accepting the challenge and finishing the trial, generally with good humour, for providing continual feedback and in the end for achieving outstanding results. Over 80% of all materials thrown into the 2 bins have been recovered for recycling.

We would like to provide more comprehensive feedback to the entire community once we have received test results from the composting process. This will take about two months because the compost piles need to fully mature before testing – you cannot hurry nature! Watch this space for the feedback date and time.

A few housekeeping aspects:

Kitchen tidy bins – the small bin provided for you to use in the kitchen is yours to keep. Unfortunately the biodegradable bags are not widely available at supermarkets, but there are various places to buy them – mainly over the internet. Please note that the

biodegradable bags are **not** recoverable in the yellow lidded bin – these will have to be discarded in the red bin.

You now have to re-think your waste management practices and go back to using the red and yellow topped bins.

Remember, only recyclable items such as cans, glass and plastic bottles and jars, newspapers and cardboard go in the yellow bin. All other items go in the red bin including your food and garden waste unless you have a home compost bin.

If anyone is unsure, please contact Councils Waste Hotline on 4429 3374 and we will be happy to assist. There is a recycling brochure enclosed in this newsletter to assist.

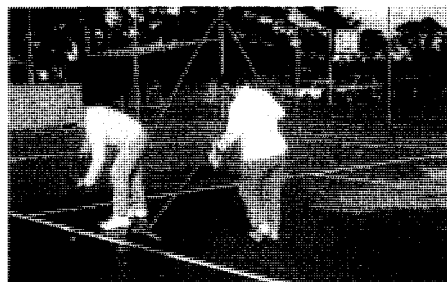
Jindyandy Christmas in July

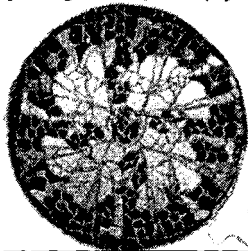
