Comorong Street Drainage – Maintenance of the drain to be undertaken and council to investigate the acquisition of an easement.

Terara Street Footpath – council will note this project on the list.

Replacement of bollards at Titania Park – Council will organise to replace the missing bollards.

Marina – Russ Pig advised that the Marina is at a standstill in the Crown Lands office.

The office is short staffed and are concentrating on the maintenance of existing facilities. Council will continue to keep this on the agenda.

Thanks to Clr Greg Watson and Clr John Fergusson for attending the GTTP meeting.

Complaints were made about a large truck/Semi Trailer parking in the Oyster Depot and leaving early in the morning, disturbing residents and making noise. Clr Watson says if the Depot is being used outside of the zoning laws, then council needs to be notified in writing in order to take action.

Tour Buses are going into and out of the Oyster depot, the corner is blind and dangerous, request to send a letter to council to see if the corner can be opened up to be more visible.

Residents have asked that if you drive a truck in town, please tie down your load to prevent truck noise and stop things falling off onto the road.

Climate change is a big issue to council, community can express concerns about climate change. This will help the council lobby the state government to take action

Idea to create a small industrial zone at the rear of the fire station, possibly could use this as part of the marina infrastructure should the marina go ahead.
